Propositions on Ballots

On November 2, 2021, New York voters will vote on five proposed amendments to the New York State Constitution. These five ballot measures may have a greater impact on the future of the Empire State than the candidates running for election.

Be sure to flip your ballot over and vote on them.

Proposal One:

In 2014, we (the voters) passed a constitutional amendment that substantially changed the redistricting process, which happens after every 10-year census. Now, before that process has even been used, the Legislature is pushing to change it.

Proposal One would:

- Repeal the requirement that the two co-executive directors of the redistricting commission be members of different parties;
- Repeal the requirement that a commission redistricting plan be approved by commission members of both parties;
- Repeal the requirement that a redistricting plan be approved by a two-thirds vote of the Legislature, if the Senate and the Assembly are each controlled by the same political party.

This is exactly the opposite of the way a fair redistricting process should operate. It seems clear that the purpose of this proposal is to cause the majority party to have unfettered control of the process.

Do you believe Democrats would be for this if Republicans currently had control?

Proposal Two:

It would amend the New York State Constitution to provide that “each person shall have a right to

clean air and water, and a healthful environment.” Progressives are framing this issue as one of racial and environmental justice.

Everyone wants clean air and water but this sounds like another club to beat us over the head with their radical “green” agenda.

Would this give them another lever to ban lead ammunition? Of course, it would.

Of course, this sounds really good but the devil is in the details.

Proposal Three:

It would remove the NY constitutional requirement that a voter wishing to vote in an election be registered to vote at least 10 days prior to that election.

It would open the door to the passage of a same-day voter registration law, an open invitation to more voter fraud. How would local election boards effectively check if the registration is valid?

Proposal Four:

This would allow no-excuse absentee balloting in New York.

Currently, the New York State Constitution allows absentee balloting only if a voter expects to be outside of his/her county of residence on Election Day; or a voter is unable to vote in person due to disability or illness.

Unlimited absentee balloting creates a climate in which voter fraud is very difficult to detect.

But if you don't believe there is voter fraud in New York - and especially New York City - and you believe one party rule will refrain from fraud even though they have the levers of power to do it.

Proposal Five:

It would expand the jurisdiction of the New York City Civil Court from \$25,000 to \$50,000.

Bullseye Pistol

NRA Precision Pistol is the granddad of handgun competition. It requires good eyes and a steady hand to hit a 10 ring the size of a nickel at 50 feet using a one hand hold.

Our league is more informal. We allow one or two-handed hold. Any type of sights allowed except for laser sights. You also don't need an expensive target pistol. Any standard .22 pistol should be fine. If you really don't have anything suitable contact me and I can bring an extra pistol.

We start at 6:30pm with .22LR then move on to centerfire. The course of fire for .22 is:

- 2 Slow Fire Targets. 10 shots in 10 minutes.
- 2 Timed Fire Targets. 20 seconds for a 5 shot string. 2 strings per target.
- 2 Rapid Fire targets. 10 seconds for a 5 shot string. 2 strings per target (for those of you that got the Common Core math class in school that is 60 shots total).

For centerfire we will shoot:

- 1 Slow Fire Target. 10 shots in 10 minutes.
- 2 Timed Fire Targets. 20 seconds for a 5 shot string. 2 strings per target (this allows the use of a revolver).

Precision shooting for the beginner to the expert Dust off that old .22 plinker and give it a try. The Bullseye League matches are held from October thru March on Thursday nights at 6:30pm. Cost is \$1.00 for rimfire and \$1.00 for centerfire.

Sporterifle

The 2021-2022 New York State Sporterifle season has begun. Sporterifle is indoor, bullseye competition with .22 rifles at 50 feet. These are not specially prepared target rifles as you might see in the Olympics, but rather, just like the .22 sitting in your gun safe feeling lonely.

The rifle may be scoped or with iron sights. We shoot 30 rounds per night at 15 bullseye targets. To make it challenging, the ten ring is merely 3/8 of an inch diameter.

There are more than 50 teams across New York and Northern Pennsylvania competing. As Sporterifle is a slow-fire sport requiring great concentration and minimal distraction, social distancing has not impacted our shooting. If the Club recommends changes due to the evolution of the guidelines, we will adapt.

The competition is postal, which means that we shoot at our home club, while the opponent shoots at their home club. We shoot for the honor of our Waterloo teams and for individual glory. Or at least team plaques and individual medals. The season is 21 weeks long, so it is not too late to join us. We'll be at the club every Tuesday and Friday evening until the end of March (excepting select Holidays). At the end of the season, the entire state shoots together at three clubs across the state for one more chance for a win. This year Waterloo will host the Central NY shoot-off on Saturday March 26.

For the last 2 seasons, we cancelled the shoot-off, but individual members brought home many medals. For the individual awards, shooters are classified based on their season average in five classifications from Rifleman to Expert. In this way, newer shooters are not immediately competing against the Experts.

Mini Palma

Dave Mette

Mini Palma is designed more for the precision .22 cal rifle shooter and is open to members and the general public. Shoots are held on the outside rifle range. Paper targets consist of 4 bulls-eye type targets at 100 yards.

The course of fire is 35 rounds fired in 5-shot strings within 5 minutes of sighting in followed by 10 rounds on three targets in 35 minutes. Each shooter competes against other participants of similar skill and the firearm used. Either prone or from a benchrest.

Cost is \$5.00 for members and \$8.00 for non-members. Matches run April thru November.

Firearms and Equipment

.22 long rifle scoped or iron sights, shooting bags, bipods, rear rest, and shooting pad.

There is a mandatory safety briefing before each match.

IDPA

One issue critical to the long term success of this shooting discipline is problems shooters are asked to solve must reflect self defense principles. IDPA should help promote basic gun handling skills and test skills a person would need in a concealed carry encounter.

Requirements such as the use of cover while engaging a target, reloading behind cover, and limiting the number of rounds per string were all based upon that principle. Cover refers to a position where a shooter can engage targets with a portion of their upper and lower body behind an object such as a wall. A course of fire should test a competitor's shooting skills. Allowances will be made for physically challenged or disabled shooters. The primary focus of IDPA is in the continuing development of safe and sound gun handling skills.

Sound like something you mite like to try? Come to a practice the second or third Monday of the month or a match the second Saturday of the month and we will help you get started.
