Survey Says....

The survey to determine WRPC member support for expanding the Club House and financing it with a three-step increase totaling \$60/year in dues is now complete. The results are that of 307 questionnaires mailed out we received 77 responses; 41 supported the expansion proposal and 36 members opposed it, abstained or said "maybe" depending upon the specifics of the proposal. Members opposing the proposal cited objections to paying more dues, or favoring alternatives such as better space utilization, having monthly meetings elsewhere, or other methods of financing such as lower dues increases and , additional fund raising projects each year. Based on the difficulty in getting our once per year fund raiser successfully completed and the probable dollar impact of the alternative suggestions, it is not clear that any of the suggestions made would result in making the Club House expansion affordable.

Based on the fact that the survey stated that *not responding to the survey would be taken as an indication of support for the proposal*, it would appear that the majority of members would support the Club House expansion. However, in deference to the members who expressed concerns or asked for a more specific proposal, the WRPC Board will progress the expansion proposal slowly and take steps to provide members with more specific information about the project costs and benefits before asking members for final approval to proceed.

Based on the survey results the WRPC Board of Directors will propose a dues increase at the February member meeting of \$25 annually to cover increased costs in utilities, maintenance, etc. over the past 11 years and the increases we anticipate over the near future. This increase will allow us to maintain current facilities and complete the capital improvements planned and approved by the members through 2021. *This will not provide funds for Club House expansion or extensive remodeling.*

Our sincere thanks to all of the members who took the time and effort to respond to this survey. Your input was fully shared with and considered by Board members.

The 2018 Fast Action/Tactical Schedule:

Sunday May 6th
Sunday June 3rd
Sunday July 1st

Registration for matches starts @ 9am and goes until 12 noon. Don't let our title fool you these are fun matches to shoot with your favorite pistols or 22lr rifles. We do allow pistol caliber carbines and lever action carbines in 9mm, 40S&W, 45LC, 38, 44spec, 45ACP, etc.(with velocities less than 1200fps). We are looking for more revolver shooters and carbine shooters this year.

It costs \$5 per gun & \$4 to re-fire the same firearm. Our matches consist of 3 stages with targets at 3 to 20 yards away from the shooting stations.(metal plate racks are at 20yds for safety). These are timed to see who can be the most accurate with the shortest time elapsed. Any category with 2 or more shooters, the 1st place finishers will win a free shoot for the next monthly match. There is a separate category for our shooters age 60 and above so you don't have to compete against the "young guys & gals"!

There is a Safety Officer at each stage to help answer your questions and give you any help you might need. We also use a Range Safety Officer who oversees the entire match from an elevated position to ensure everyone stays safe while having fun shooting. Come out and join us. IDPA

Have you ever went to draw your gun and get a hand full of shirt ? Then when you get it out of your holster and go to fire and nothing happens till you figure out the safety is on. Ever have a stovepipe or a double feed and your gun jams? These are all things that can and do happen when you're shooting. If you don't practice, these things could happen to you at the worst possible time and you won't know what to do.

When shooting International Defensive Pistol (IDPA) You will learn how to draw from a holster while wearing a cover garment. Getting your safety off will be second nature to you and you will do it automatically. If you have a stovepipe you'll know how to clear it. If you draw and your gun goes click you'll do a tap rack (tap your magazine to seat it and rack the slide to chamber a round). If your gun jams you'll drop the magazine to clear it and throw in a new magazine and continue shooting. These are all skills that you develop when shooting IDPA. They will help you should you ever find yourself at the wrong end of a dark alley.

IDPA matches are the second Saturday of the month starting at 10am. If this is something you would like to do come to a practice on the second or third Monday of the month at 6:30 and we will help you get started.

Bullseye Pistol

Our 2017/18 season is nearing an end. For those new members who don't know what Bullseye Pistol is all about, here is a brief synopsis.

Start Time: 7:00pm, in the past we have moved the start time to 6:30, if all participants agreed.

Fee: \$2.00 for the match, \$3.00 for the club put into box.

Guns: Any .22 revolver or semi automatic pistol, at least 60 rounds of ammunition. Any center fire revolver or semi automatic pistol (under 1500 fps), at least 30 rounds of ammunition.

Firearms are not to be brought to the match loaded!

Courses of fire:

Slow Fire - 10 shots to be fired in under 10 minutes. Only one command is given for loading your firearm.

Timed Fire - 2 strings of 5 shots each. Command to load 5 rounds is given before each string of fire. Time allowed for each string is 20 seconds.

Rapid Fire - 2 strings of 5 shots each. Command to load 5 rounds is given before each string of fire. Time allowed for each string is 10 seconds.

Range Commands:

Shooters on the line, this is the Slow / Timed / Rapid Fire portion of the match "X" number of strings, and each string fired in 10min / 20sec / 10sec.

On the firing line with up to 10 / 5 rounds loaded.

Is the line ready, (pause) the line is ready (speak up if you are not ready)

Ready on the right (pause)

Ready on the left (pause)

Ready on the firing line (pause)

At the sound of the buzzer commence firing.

At the next sound of the buzzer cease firing.

Alibi: If you have any malfunction, and do not complete the string of fire. Let the range officer know that you have an alibi before the start of the next string of fire. You are then given the opportunity to re-shoot the entire string.

Scoring: score your target, enter your score(s) on the sign in sheet, if you wish your score to be recorded.
